

















SHORT TERM GOVERNMENT ACTION PLAN FOR TOURISM DEVELOPMENT

- Extension of the runway of the Jacmel and Cayes airports and opening of these facilities to international traffic
- Rehabilitation of the Toussaint Louverture International Airport terminal in Port-au-Prince

- Reconfiguration of the Cap-Haïtien port and marina into a tender dock
- Support of the private sector improvements to existing hospitality and conventions facilities
- Construction of new hospitality training centers/ schools for each tourism development Region








FUTURE PERSPECTIVES OF TOURISM IN HAÏTI

• Hotel infrastructures

- Growth in business tourism
- 2012/2013: 1,250 new rooms
- Investments: approximately 150 M US\$
- 8,000 direct and indirect jobs created





• Transportation

- 3 new touristic ground transportation companies
- Investments: approximately 4 M US\$
- 80 direct and indirect jobs created



GUIDING PRINCIPLES OF THE GOVERNMENT TOURISM STRATEGY

 Supports and facilitates the development of the tourism industry



A competitive Investment Code:

- **Total exoneration from income taxes** for a period which shall not exceed 15 consecutive years, then gradual tax for five years;
- **Exoneration from local taxes** except the fixed professional • tax for a period which shall not exceed 15 years;
- Accelerated depreciation;
- Fiscal and duties exoneration on the import of equipment goods and materials;
- **Exemption from licensing** of foreign expatriate employees;
- **Possibility of building infrastructures** that are insufficient or inexistent;
- Other incentives.



- Promoting public and private sector partnerships in hospitality and infrastructure projects
- An active National Tourism Development Council
- Based on sustainable development indicators with respect of cultural integrity, protection of the environment, durability of the products, involvement of regional communities in activity programs (attractions)



GOVERNMENT GOALS IN TERMS OF SHORT- AND MEDIUM-TERM ECONOMIC IMPACTS

- More than 3,500 new hotel rooms
- More than 500 M US\$ invested for private-sector hotel/ **convention construction projects**
- More than 400 M US\$ spent in the Haïtian economy
